Describing the main features of Describing the main features of the bath and the filter, Dr. Hay-man said the bath was 25 metres long (about 82 feet) and 32 feet wide. On the shallow end its depth is 44 feet and in the deep end 84 of water.

#### FILTRATION PLANT

The filtration plant circulates the water once in every 8 hours and is kept ninning for 12 hours each day. The water is tested at least thrice a day. The bath is cleared generally by the boys using a suction sweeper, which acts rather like a vacuum cleaner. This removes any loose deposits from the bottom
