


The meeting was closed at 8.45 p.m. At the invitation of the President the members stood and sang the College Song with much enthusiasm.

The surplus of sales proceeds after deduction of expenses will benefit S. Thomas' College, Mount Lavinia, Sri Lanka by donation to institute a new Organ Scholarship at S. Thomas' College as suggested by Revd. Roy h. Yin, ('Father Yin') who envisaged such a scholarship might entitle the holder to free education at the college and cover the cost of special tuition in music, and particularly the organ, possibly partly in Sri Lanka and partly overseas. "Such a scholarship could be of immense benefit, not only to the College, but to the whole music scene in Sri Lanka", said Father Yin in his letter dated 6 Jan 1994 to the Warden.

The annual Stag Night, hosted on this occasion by the STCOBA, was held at the Mount Waverley Youth Centre on Friday 25th February 2011. The night was a great success, although the numbers were slightly down on last year.

Great musical entertainment was provided by the DJ, old Thomian Chevindra De Mel, and it was pleasing to see the many old boys from both schools getting into the spirit of the evening and dancing the baila and singing some of the old songs that we used to belt out with gusto during our school days. More risqué entertainment was also provided by the mandatory stripper but this was an interlude of no more than 20 minutes. Many of the guests were no doubt disappointed that this was not of longer duration, the more prudish members of the two OBAs perhaps having kept away altogether for fear that their presence would be regarded as a descent into moral turpitude. This reminds me of the time a few years ago when I rang up a couple of members to ask if they were interested in attending the stag night: one said if there were strippers, then he wouldn't be attending, while the other said if there weren't strippers, it was not worthwhile being present! Such nights are not everyone's cup of tea but some of us older members need to consider supporting more actively those functions about which we are lukewarm so that we can persuade our younger members to attend those functions which we cherish. Of course, it seems clear that the old Royalists have many more youngish old boys who are members of their OBA than we do of ours, hence their more enthusiastic response.

To absorb the alcohol consumed, we all enjoyed the sumptuous dinner prepared by Duleep Boteju in the form of stringhopper buriyani, kotthu roti and yellow rice with the usual accompanying curries, and ice cream for dessert.

One cause for disappointment at this year's stag night (as well as at many of the other functions we hold) was that there were a few people who made solemn bookings but did not attend the function.

A lot of hard work goes into the organisation of a function, and it would be remiss of me not to thank all those who helped to make the evening a success, including my fellow members of the sub-committee, Asfan Thajudeen, Peneeth Goonawardena and Nabil Mubarak, as well as Lalith Aponso for manning the desk and attending to the important function of collecting and accounting for the funds received on the night, and also all those who helped to set up and clear the hall, including our president, Trevor Mendis. ROYAL- THOMIAN CRICKET MATCH PLAYED AT MULGRAVE CRICKET GROUND

Perhaps we should have known that Sunday the 27th February 2011 was going to be an inauspicious day for we had been informed a few days previously that the old Royalists were unable to field an over-40s side this year, leaving only the main, or open, game to be played. This caused much disappointment to the old Thomians in that category. Perhaps the Thomians were quite enjoying the experience of humbling their counterparts at the match each year, and wanted to continue the feeling of superiority! Whatever the reasons for the old Royalists' over-40s players going AWOL, it was a matter of regret to us that Claud Reid was unable to achieve a singular milestone of having participated in every match held in Melbourne since its inception in 1971.

The day itself was miserable and the rain did not ease until after 11.00 am and even then there was intermittent drizzle. However, we should be grateful to the hardy young players from both schools who gathered together to continue our annual tradition. Play eventually commenced around 2.00pm, after an early lunch had been taken. With the turf wicket being unsuitable for use, it was decided that the match would be played on the adjoining ground with a synthetic wicket although even that outfield was very damp. It was also decided to reduce the match to a Twenty20 format in view of the time lost.

The Thomians, who fielded first, had the worst of the conditions because the ball soon became like a piece of soap and it became difficult to bowl, let alone field, but the old Royalists made hay while the sun (of sorts) shone, with Channa Gunawardana scoring 48n.o. in the Royalists' total of 120 for 7. The Thomian captain, Asfan Thajudeen, was the pick of the bowlers, taking 3 for 19. In reply, the Thomians could only muster a paltry 65, with Asfan Thajudeen, 15, Peneeth Goonawardena, 15n.o., and D. Pilapitiya, 14, being the only ones to really trouble the scorers. Sanjeewa Udumalagala, the Royal captain, captured 3 wickets for 10 runs and Lakmal Abeysekera 2 for 17. The Thomians were outplayed in every facet of the game and the Royalists thoroughly deserved their victory.

The inclement weather resulted in a paltry crowd of spectators and a mountain of wasted food after the match. Some members of the committees of STCOBA and RCOBAA will meet together during the course of the year to discuss arrangements for next year. If we are to maintain the Melbourne Royal-Thomian tradition, we need to review every few years how we can continue to keep the joint event meaningful and attractive to members and spectators. The Royal-Thomian events in Colombo are self-sustaining but the same cannot be said for our events here.
