The College has approximately 106 Employees. The Tutorial Staff consists of approximately 35 (of whom approximately 10 are attached to the Primary School and the balance to the Middle and Upper School).

There are approximately 18 Employees in Accounts, Administration, Miscellaneous etc, etc, etc. The Minor Staff consists of approximately 53 Employees.

There are 09 Teachers who have served for over 10 years and 10 teachers who have served for over 05 years. 02 are Trained Teachers in Maths, 02 in English and 01 in Science and 01 in primary teaching. There are 12 Graduates teaching. There are 309 Sinhala students 47 Tamil students and 57 Muslim Students in the entire school. Of them 53 are Christians 268 are Buddhists 37 Hindus and 55 of the Islamic Faith.

20 members of the Tutorial Staff reside on the Campus, and 16 of them in the married quarters. 04 members of the Tutorial Staff reside in the bachelors quarters. 17 members of the Tutorial Staff travel to school daily.

Mr.B M Sufiyan - Islam in years 9,10,11 Tamil Language in years 10 & 11, Social Studies in yrs. 10 & 11, Agriculture in year 10, Tamil as a 2nd Language in yrs 8,10 & 11

Mr.Kaneshamoorhty - Hindusim in Years 6,7 8 9 10 & 11. Tamil Language in years 10 & 11, Art in years 10, Class teacher of year 09.

Mr.V Jayaratnam - Christianity for years 6,7 & 9, Tamil Language in years 6,7 Science in years 6,10,& 11, Art in years 6,7 & 8, Tamil as a 2nd Language in year 10 and Class teacher in years 6 & 7.

The following 02 Members of the Staff are involved in Sports activities only.

1. Mr.S K M Azain - General Supervisor of Squash & Swimming. NB. There is a visiting coach for swimming and swimming is done under his guidance.
2. Mr.Kulatunga - Karate trainer. Visiting coach. Only in Saturdays.

2. **Sports and Extra Curricular Activities**

Sports and allied activities down the years have included Cricket, Hockey, Soccer, Rugger, Athletics, Tennis, Basket Ball, Squash, Boxing, Badminton, Volley Ball, Swimming, Water Polo, Life Saving, Horse Riding, Rifle Shooting, Boating, Mountain Trekking, Hiking, Cross Country Runs, Bird Watching, Scouting, Weight Lifting, Karate, Gymnastics, Cadetting, Scouting, Cubbing, Outward Bound School.

Tennis, Boxing, Water Polo, Horse Riding, Rifle Shooting, Boating Mountain Trekking, Hiking, Cross country runs, Bird Watching, Gymnastics, and Outward Bound School are not available at present.

3. **HOUSES**

All the students in College i.e Boarders and Day Boys are divided in to the 04 houses, i.e Hayman, Garnier, Reid and De Saram.

4. **DORMS**

STUDENTS IN THE BOARDING ARE ACCOMMODATED IN SEVERAL DORMITORIES.

There are 281 boarders (and 132 day boys). The Boarding is only for male students. The females are mostly the children of the tutorial staff and minor staff. The school is divided into the Primary, Middle School and the Senior School. A Boarder pays approximately Rs.2,000/- as boarding fees. A student pays approximately Rs.1500/- as School Fees.

KEBLE DORM

The Primary school is in the Keble complex having students from Year 01 to Year 05. There are 08 dormitories/rooms all under one roof, i.e. contiguous. The students are divided into these dormitories according to their classes (more or less age-wise) There are 05 ayahs to look after the very young. Food for these boys are prepared in the main kitchen of the school and brought to the Keble complex in the Hand Tractor. In the case of bread, and afternoon buns/rolls etc., the Hand Tractor will pick up those items from the school bakery which is midway. Preparation of tea is also done in the Main Kitchen. Only Drinking Water is prepared in the kitchen adjacent to the main dining hall of Keble. There is a Matron in charge of Keble and 2 teachers who reside in between the dormitories referred to. There is a security post in close proximity to the Gurutalawa Village End Gate of the Campus. i.e at the entrance to the Keble Complex.

The 1st Room contains only broken beds & mattresses which are piled up. The 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th Rooms had 6,5,6,6 and 6 Beds. Almost all were occupied. Only grade 05 students are accommodated in these 05 Rooms.

The 7th Room had 22 Beds. All were occupied. 20 Grade 4s and 2 Grade 5s were accommodated in this Room.

The 8th room had 26 Beds. (02 Beds were unoccupied) Students of Grades 1,2,3 & 4 were accommodated in this Room. Of them Grade 1 had 01 Tamil and 02 Sinhala, Grade 2 had 01 Tamil and 03 Sinhala, Grade 3 had 02 Tamil and 04 Sinhala and Grade 4 had 10 Sinhala Students

There is a Room and Toilet used by the Matron of Keble Dorm.

Other areas belonging to Keble, are the Hall, Dinning Room, Kitchen, Toilets & Playground.

There were 32 new entrants at Keble in 2002. In June 67 students out of the full compliment of 77 were available. Others were absent, (not yet returned after Vesak and long holidays).

Playtime of Keble is from 3:00 pm to 4:30 pm. Prep is at 5:00 pm and dinner is served at 6:45 pm. On rainy days the school provides indoor games. The students bring their own equipment for outdoor games. There is also a television set fixed in the hall. Cartoon programs are switched on for students according to their likes and they are sometimes permitted to watch a film. The Playground at Keble need attention as a part of it is covered by grass. The ground can be extended to cover the grass area as well and properly laid and maintained, so that the students have a fairly large area to play about.

Mrs.D M Anandappa is the class teacher for Year 2 and teaches English for the Years 1,2 &3 and once a week for Years 4 & 5. She also teaches Elocution for the Years 1,2 & 3 after school. The Chaplain Father Nihal Fernando teaches Elocution for the Years 4 & 5 after school. This Section could do with another English teacher, particularly for Years 4 & 5. Mrs.Valentina Jeganathan who resides in Keble teaches science in the Middle school. Students go home on regular weekends and even at other times. This appears to be the order of the day. Parents are found loitering in the dormitories and there is no visitors' room provided.

THE MIDDLE SCHOOL / JUNIOR DORMS

The Middle School is from year 6 up to year 8 and the Boarders are in the Junior dorms, i.e Foster (formerly Winchester), De Saram, Garnier and Reid. The students are divided into dormitories according to their classes (more or less age-wise). i.e Year 6 in Foster, Years 6 & 7 in Reid, Year 8 in De Saram and Year 8 in Garnier. There is a Master in charge of discipline for all 4 Junior Dormitories whose quarters has easy access to the Junior Dormitories.

1. Foster Dorm has Year 6 students only. Present occupancy is 38 students. The maximum number that can be accommodated is 38. Out of the 38 students 18 are from Keble and the balance students are from outside schools. At present there are 5 Bunk beds holding 10 students and the rest are single beds. This dorm can accommodate more bunk beds. The Dorm Master is Mr.M.B.R.C.Kumara.
2. Reid Dorm has Year 7 students only. Present occupancy is 32 students. The maximum number that can be accommodated is 32. Out of the 32 students there are 4 newcomers from outside schools. At present there are

3 vacancies in the Dorm, and all the beds are single beds. The Dorm can accommodate bunk beds as well. The Dorm Master is Mr. V. Ganeshamurthi but presently Mr.suffiyan is in charge of the dorm.

3. De Saram Dorm has Year 8 students only. Present occupancy is 22 students. The maximum number that can be accommodated is 28. Out of the 22 students only 3 are from outside schools. At present all are single beds. Can accommodate bunk beds. The Dorm Master is Mr.W.H.Ellepola.
4. Garnier Dorm (Jr) has Year 8 & 9 students only. Present occupancy is 20 students. Out of the 20 students there is only 1 newcomer from outside school. At present there are 3 vacancies in the Dorm. At present there are 5 bunk beds in the dorm and the rest are all single beds. The Dorm can accommodate more bunk beds. The Dorm Master is Mr.W.H.Ellepola.
5. Winchester Dorm has Year 9 students only. Present occupancy is 26 students. The maximum number that can be accommodated is 26. Out of the 26 students there are 2 from outside schools. At present all are single beds. The Dorm can accommodate bunk beds. The Dorm Master is Mr.Darmawardena.

SENIOR SCHOOL/ SENIOR DORMS

The Senior Dormitories are Winchester, De Saram, Garnier, Reid and Hayman. The last is an additional dormitory built at the extreme end close to the main entrance of the College. A new Dorm below the Basket Ball Court next to the Co-op stores within sight of the other 04 Senior Dorms mentioned above is called "Winchester". The students in the above dorms other than Winchester are divided into dormitories according to their Houses. In Winchester there is a mixture of all 04 Houses.

1. Hayman Dorm has Year 10 & 11 students only. Present occupancy is 18 students. The maximum number that can be accommodated is about 30. There are no outside students. At present all are single beds. The Dorm can accommodate bunk beds. The Dorm Master is Mr.S.Medawela, and he is occupying the quarters i.e. the room below the sick room – accessible from the sick room stairs or from pool side.
2. Garnier has Year 10 & 11 students only. Present occupancy is 24 students. The maximum number that can be accommodated is about 30. Out of the 30 students there is only one new student from outside. At present all the beds in the Dorm are single beds. The Dorm can accommodate bunk beds.

The Dorm Master is Mr.Gayan Tammita who is presently occupying quarters in the middle section block.

3. Reid has Year 10 & 11 students only. The present occupancy is 19 students. The maximum number that can be accommodated is about 30. There are no new students. At present all are single beds. The Dorm can accommodate bunk beds. The Dorm Master is Mr.B.M.Suffiyan.
4. De Saram has Year 10 & 11 students only. Present occupancy is 12 students. The maximum number that can be accommodated is about 20 to 25. There are no outside students. At present all are single beds. The Dorm can accommodate bunk beds. The Dorm Master is Mr.W.H.Ellepola.

In the Senior dorms the accommodation has increased due to the removal of pillars which stood in the middle of the Dorms during the recent repairs etc.

Two rooms behind the Senior Dorms were demolished. Two were repaired, out of which one is given to the security and the other to Mr. Jayawardena of the, academic – staff who is teaching Maths to Upper School classes and who stays in School on certain days.

5. THE STUDENTS, CLASSES AND SUBJECTS

Classes presently range from Yr.1 to Yr.11, i.e culminating with the G C E (O/L) Exams. The Nursery Class was abandoned as it was not a success. Girls are admitted provided they start at year 1 and they are permitted to proceed right upto year 11. The A/L Classes were suppressed in 2000 for the Sinhala Medium and in April 2002 for the Tamil Medium. The Subjects taught are Christianity, Buddhism, Islam, Hinduism, Sinhala Language, English Language, Tamil Language, English Literature, Science, Maths, Social Studies, Art, Music, Dancing, Agriculture, Building Technology, Commerce, Electrical Technology. All these subjects are offered for the G C E (O/L) Exam.

Students are required to select **ONE** out of the subjects Christianity, Buddhism, Islam and Hinduism. Sinhala Language or Tamil Language is selected as the first language. English is a compulsory 2nd language. Maths, Science and Social Studies are all compulsory subjects. The Technical subjects are Commerce, Agriculture, Building Construction and EEC. Students may select **ANY ONE** of these optional subjects. The Aesthetic subjects available are Art, Music and Dancing. Students may select **ANY ONE** of these optional subjects. Sinhala or Tamil may be offered as the Second Language. Health and Physical Education, Sinhala Literature, English Literature, Geography and Development Studies are

available as additional subjects. Students may choose **ANY ONE** of them. Life skills is available from Grade 6 to 9 but is not a subject offered for the exam.

We set out below figures related to female students in the College as at June 1st 2002.

There are 09,06,09,09,10 & 04 Tamil Students in years 6,7,8,9,10 & 11 respectively aggregating to 47

Therefore, in the Middle and Upper School Tamil Stream there are only 47 children. There are 9 Tamil stream teachers.

Another English teacher especially for year 6 to year 11 will be useful.

Profiles were completed by 330 students and 95 members of the staff and minor staff to enable us to make the necessary analysis and assessment. 83 students and 12 members of the staff and minor staff had not submitted their profiles. The survey was accomplished between June 01st and June 15th and involved students from year 1 – 11 in both the Sinhala and Tamil Medium.

According to the data submitted there were 320 male students and 10 female students. The number according to race was Sinhala 236, Tamil 42 and Muslims 47. There were 203 Buddhists, 30 Hindus, 54 of the Islamic Faith and 43 Christians.

According to the data submitted, the main language spoken at home is Sinhala in the case of 207, Tamil in the case of 79 and English in the case of 07 Students, Malay in the case of 01 student and Arabic in the case of 01 student. 13 students made no response to this query. 185 students were Boarders in the College, 12 boarded elsewhere and 84 students travelled from their homes. The answer of 4 students were illegible.
