REPORT OF THE SUB-COMMITTEE FOR NEWSLETTERS January 28,2002

A. **NEWSLETTERS**

Issue No.4 of the Newsletter was sent out to 655 Members in Sri Lanka and 45 Members outside Sri Lanka. In addition, it was sent to 30 non members including the Bishop, Members of the Board of Governors, Headmasters of the Branch Schools, Librarians of the Branch Schools and others.

A very brief Issue No.5 may be sent out for the purpose of –

- a) giving the latest update on the Development Projects that have been completed and are presently going on at Gurutalawa; and
- b) Indicating the Agenda, Programme of Events, and other arrangements being made at Gurutalawa in co-ordination with the Headmaster in connection with the AGM and the Annual Re-Union of Old Boys with particular reference to the additional sports events, the evening of Fellowship and Dinner on Saturday as well as the Holly Communion Service in the Chapel and the AGM on Sunday morning and the Traditional Gurutalawa Boarding House Lunch on Sunday.

Members will be kept informed of the return to the Traditional Dinner having some Dignity and Decorum with Grace being said as befits an occasion of this nature in a Christian Educational Institution.

The total cost of printing of the Newsletters has been Rs.69,940/- and the cost of postage thereof has been Rs.32,786/- aggregating to Rs.102,726/-. These expenses have been met by Old Boys.

It is hoped that the Newsletter will be continued by the new Ex-Co that will come in to office at the end of February, 2003.

B. COLLEGE MAGAZINE

The preliminary proof of the College Magazine was approved and returned. The final proof should be ready in a day or two. About 450 copies of the Magazine will be printed.

The Headmaster will be handed over about 430 copies to be given to the students, masters and the library at Gurutalawa. The balance copies will be available to Old Boys. The Magazine was renewed after the lapse of over a decade. It is hoped that the College will be able to continue with this important Journal henceforth after the new life given by the present Ex-Co. Important Reports which were held over/not made available could be published in the next issue.
